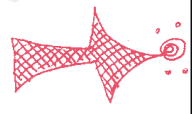

## HOW TO GET THE BEST FROM YOUR DODO ACAD-PAD

### DOODLING

Special facilities have been provided in the design of the Dodo ACAD-PAD for this essential activity. The Dodo ACAD-PAD encourages you to doodle creatively and thereby preserve the covers of nearby library books, café tables, train/bus head-rests, college walls etc. Those at a loss for inspiration will find suggestive hints to quicken their imagination on every diary page. A blank, or nearly blank, space is also provided for this purpose on facing pages.

### FURTHER USES FOR THE DODO ACAD-PAD
